1. Open Special Meeting:

2. Consider a resolution approving an Agreement of Cooperation with Dallas County for the Community Development Block Grant and HOME Program (to continue the program for three more years):

3. Town Hall Meeting: Presentation and receive input on the Lee Engineering Traffic Study:

Mayor Felix introduced the item and the ground rules. Lee Engineering presented the findings of their study. The study recommended the removal of two stop signs on Woodbridge Parkway.
